Mandatory Reporters

Mandatory reporters are staff & faculty, including undergraduate & graduate staff, who are required to share information pertaining to harassment, discrimination, sexual misconduct, & related retaliation with the Office of Civil Rights & Title IX (OCRTIX). Mandatory reporters must report potential incidents of harassment or discrimination based on 16 protected classes.

Mandatory Reporting to OCRTIX

Sexual Misconduct Definition

Conduct on the basis of sex (including sexual orientation, gender identity, & gender expression) that constitutes Quid Pro Quo Sexual Harassment, Hostile Environment Sexual Harassment, Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, or Stalking.

Mandatory Reporters need to make a report when they are made aware of potential harassment or discrimination based on identities, sexual misconduct & related retaliation. This might include:

- Unwelcome physical touching or closeness that might not rise to the level of Sexual Assault.
- A student spreading rumors about another's perceived identity.
- A professor avoids calling on an international student in class to avoid pronouncing their name.
- Someone experiences distress from a protest on campus pertaining to an identity.
- A peer's partner has been coming to campus looking for them repeatedly. You are concerned about their dynamic.
