The Clery Act

The Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act requires all colleges and universities receiving federal funding to gather, keep, and disclose information on specific crimes and hazing occurring on, or near, their campus.

The goal of the Clery Act is "to provide the campus community with timely, accurate and complete information about crime and the safety of campus so that they can make informed decisions to keep themselves safe." Simply put, it is a Safety Consumer Law.

KU relies on Campus Security Authorities (CSAs) to report crimes in order to help keep campus safe. CSAs are identified as:

- Working in campus police or security department
- Responsible for aspects of on-campus security
- Having significant responsibility for student and campus activities.

Crimes motivated by perpetrator's bias against the victim's protected class.

Hate crimes include:

and all primary crimes, except: Manslaughter by Negligence

Contact your local police to report crimes that are ongoing, or pose an imminent or ongoing threat.

For crimes that have concluded and there is no ongoing threat, you may report them to police or using our reporting form.
